iPad[®] Pilot Program

GOAL

Supporting Alaskans who are d/ Deaf, hard of hearing, or speechdisabled to access distance communication through tablets and appropriate applications (apps).

EXAMPLES

Telecommunication use under the iPad Pilot Program:

- Video Relay Service
- IP Relay or Captioned Telephone Service
- Video calls through FaceTime or Skype
- Access distance
 communication via
 non-symbol based
 Alternative Augmentative
 Communication (AAC)
 Applications. Individuals
 must be able to use text based communication.





Sprint IP Relay

Type what you want to say to the operator, the operator relays the message to the person you called and then types their response back to you. App shown above.



AVA

Provides real time captions by capturing audio from a conversation and translating it into text.



Glide

A video messenger that allows you to send and receive video messages that can be seen live (as you're recording) or later (like a text message).



Predictable

Speaks out the messages as they are typed giving a voice to someone who is unable to use their own.



Proloquo4Text

A simplified text based communication app for those with strong literacy skills needing a means for communication.

Cordless Amplified Phone

- Speakerphone
- Answering machine
- Talking caller ID
- Can get up to 50 db



Corded Amplified Phone

- Large button
- Speakerphone
- Can get up to 50 db



Sonic Alert Flasher

Flasher that alerts you to:

- Videophone
- Telephone
- TTY



Outgoing Speech Amplified Phone

- Outgoing Speech Amplification
- Super loud ringer
- Can get up to 40 db outgoing
